







Centered on humanity, this approach intertwines natural, crafting spaces that echo the essence of well-being, productivity, and enriched living.




- Biophilic design principles have the greatest impact where we have moved furthest from nature: into urban spaces. Urbanization continues: 66% of the developed world's population will live in cities by 2055.1
- There is a correlation between the urbanization of our society and rising stress rates, which can be reduced through a green environment.
 Tip: Bring in natural light and materials, use natural colors and focus on air quality.
- Natural materials, patterns, textures, and colors that mimic nature can enhance well-being and have positive, physiological effects.
- Healthy lifestyles are on a rise, and so is the need for unprocessed or moderately unprocessed food.




"Grow Your Own Food"




08 Bold Colors & Patterns

- Rounding out the room: a pill-shape kitchen island is trending. For a more subtle impact add lightings with a globe or half-moon shape or add a round rug.




A LITTLE GLOSS AT HOME
